We will produce a number of key training resources in collaboration with other Programs to move our patient-oriented research into action.

Azrieli CHILD-BRIGHT Fellowship Program

• \$1.2M in funding to support Phase 2 Network Projects in hiring up to 24 PDFs



These include:

- Practical & Advanced Training in IS/KM/EDI-DI
- Coaching, Mentorship, and Enhanced Skills Development
- Summer Studentship Training Program

Summer Studentship Program

\$100K in funding to support Phase 2 Network Projects to hire up to 5 students over each summer term



Graduate Student POR Fellowship

\$200K to support Phase 2 Network Projects to hire graduate trainees

IS/KM Innovation Fund

• \$40K to promote the development of innovative capacity-building tools to foster capacity in IS and KM.



"The biggest takeaway for me personally was that involving patient partners in every step of the research process leads to better results with higher impacts."






"I have learned that patient-oriented research should be the foundation of all research. [...] Patients are experts in their own experiences and that should always be valued and respected in all stages of research."
